Regular Session

The Bellevue City Council met on Monday, February 6, 2017 in a Regular Session at 6:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers with Mayor Christopher J. Roling presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. The roll was called as follows:

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mayor Roling reviewed the Agenda and declared it approved

CONSENT AGENDA

Roth moved with a second by Heiar to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

INTRODUCTION, CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF THE SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE 419 AMENDING TITLE III COMMUNITY PROTECTION CHAPTER 3 TRAFFIC CODE SUBSECTION 19 PARKING REGULATIONS TO PROHIBIT TRUCK TRACTORS AND SEMI-TRAILERS FROM PARKING ON CITY STREETS

Feuerbach moved with a second by Heiar to approve the second reading of Ordinance 419. Councilmember Tim Roth questioned if anyone has contacted City Hall to dispute the proposed Ordinance. City Administrator Loras Herrig replied no. Roll call vote carried unanimously

EMERALD ASH BORER

Herrig said signs of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has been discovered in the City but the official results are still pending. Parks Director Warren Crouch provided information to the Council that the City owns 148 ash trees with 38 trees showing definite signs of EAB including five critical trees located on the south end of Riverview Park. After a long discussion, Feuerbach moved with a second by Roth to approve the removal of five ash trees on the south end of Riverview Park. Motion carried unanimously.

FYE 2018 BUDGET UPDATE

Herrig provided the Council with handouts for the first Budget Work Session meeting. The proposed budget is showing a 3.53% tax increase. Herrig agreed that he still needs to complete and then the Council needs to approve the December 2016's Annual Urban Renewal Report prior to publishing the budget's public hearing.

REVIEW ORDINANCE NO. 421 DRAFT AMENDING PARKING REGULATIONS

Herrig indicated City Attorney Steve Kahler is completing a new ordinance that would prohibit truck, trailer, and recreational vehicles from parking on Park Street, Jefferson Street and Second Street. Discussion on the first reading will take place at the next regular Council meeting.
