

March 7, 2012
Regular Session

The Bellevue City Council met in regular session on March 7, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers with Mayor Christopher J. Roling presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. The roll call was as follows:

PRESENT: Councilmembers Gary Feuerbach, Allan Ernst and Darla Lawson. Also present were City Administrator Loras Herrig, Editor Sara Millhouse, Police Chief Lynn Schwager, Police Officer Cody Sieverding and Brenda Ernst

ABSENT: Councilmembers Dan Blitgen and Tim Roth

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mayor Roling reviewed the Agenda and declared it approved with the following additions:

1. Police Chief Lynn Schwager/Drug Task Force
2. Park Benches and Park Trees
3. Cable Issues

POLICE CHIEF LYNN SCHWAGER/DRUG TASK FORCE

Chief Schwager was present to discuss possible funding for involvement in a drug task force. The Police Chiefs in Jackson County along with the Sheriff's Department recently discussed a need for increased drug enforcement. Schwager requested that part time Police Officer Cody Sieverding be allowed to attend a two week course that is being offered by the Drug Enforcement Agency. The class will be in April and located in Johnston, Iowa. The course is free of charge with no cost for the rooms. The City's cost would be 80 hours of salary for Cody and his meals. Cody's current salary is \$15.00 per hour, with a total cost estimated to be from \$1200-\$1500. It was moved by Lawson and seconded by Ernst to allow Cody Sieverding to participate in the Drug Enforcement Agency course being offered in April. Motion carried unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA

It was moved by Ernst and seconded by Feuerbach to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

CITY HALL ROOF UPDATE

Herrig presented information on repairs or replacement of the City Hall roof. A quote was received for roof repair from Geisler Brothers of Dubuque in the amount of \$6500. There was also a quote from Kieffer Plbg. & Htg. for \$6600 for repair and relocation of the air conditioner

unit that is on the roof. This would make a total cost for all repairs at \$13,100.00. Herrig authorized the repairs to be done. After reviewing the information the Council concurred with his decision.

HERITAGE DAY DANCE

The Council reviewed the minutes of the most recent Heritage Days Committee meeting. In the minutes the Committee noted they were working on a band/bands for Cole Park on June 30th. It is possible they would play from 6-11:00 p.m. Since the normal closing hours for the park is 10:30 the Heritage Days Committee is asking for approval for the extended half hour. It was moved by Feuerbach and seconded by Ernst to approve the extension to 11:00 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

RTA VAN UPDATE

Herrig presented the list of donors for the recent purchase of the RTA van. The Council thanked all the donors for the much needed van. The total cost to the City was approximately \$1500 after all donations. The Council also discussed the installation of an automated lift for the van. Herrig spoke with Mark Munson, Director of RTA, and at the present time there are no automated systems available. If one becomes available the City would be interested in supporting the installation. Munson will keep the City informed.

ORDINANCE NO. 377 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN INCREASE IN THE LOCAL HOTEL AND MOTEL TAX RATE, PROVIDING FOR RATE, EFFECTIVE DATE, AND DISPOSITION OF COLLECTED REVENUES AS AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTIONS 423A.4 THROUGH 423A.7, CODE OF IOWA (2011)

It was moved by Lawson and seconded by Ernst to approve the third and final reading and passage into law upon publication of Ordinance No. 377. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 377

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN INCREASE IN THE LOCAL HOTEL AND MOTEL TAX RATE, PROVIDING FOR RATE, EFFECTIVE DATE, AND DISPOSITION OF COLLECTED REVENUES AS AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTIONS 423A.4 THROUGH 423A.7, CODE OF IOWA (2011)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section A. ORDINANCE NO. 129 of the City of Bellevue, Iowa, approved January 10, 1988 with an effective date of April 1, 1989, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. A Local Hotel and Motel Tax is hereby established within the corporate boundaries of the City of Bellevue, Jackson County, Iowa.

Section 2. Definitions. "Lodging" as used herein shall include rooms, apartments or sleeping quarters in a hotel, motel, inn, public lodging house, rooming house, manufactured or mobile home which is tangible personal property, or in a tourist court, or in any place where sleeping accommodations are furnished to transient guests for rent, whether with or without meals. "Renting", "Rent" or "Rented" as used herein shall mean a transfer of possession or control of lodging for a fixed or indeterminate term for consideration and includes any kind of direct or indirect charge for such lodging or its use. "Lessor" as used herein shall mean any person or legal entity engaged in the business of renting lodging to any person or legal entity. "Sales Price" as used herein shall include the total amount of consideration, including cash, credit, property and services, for which lodging is rented.

Section 3. The Sales Price for Lodging shall be taxed at a rate of seven percent (7%); provided however, this tax shall not apply to the sales price from the renting of lodging which is rented to the same person or legal entity for a period of more than thirty-one (31) consecutive days.

Section 4. The effective date for the increase of the existing local hotel and motel tax rate from five percent (5%) to seven percent (7%) shall be July 1, 2012. The City of Bellevue, Iowa shall provide notice by mail of such action to the Iowa State Director of Revenue not less than forty-five (45) days prior to the effective date for the increase in the local hotel and motel tax rate.

Section 5. The lessor shall add the local hotel and motel tax to the sales price of the lodging, and the local hotel and motel tax, when collected, shall be stated as a distinct item on the receipt, separate and apart from the sales price of the lodging and the state-imposed tax under Iowa Code § 423A.3.

Section 6. The Iowa State Director of Revenue shall provide all necessary and appropriate forms for reporting and collecting the local hotel and motel tax.

Section 7. Upon receipt the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance will deposit the local hotel and motel taxes collected under this Ordinance into a local transient guest tax fund as provided under Iowa Code §§ 423A.6 and 423A.7. The local hotel and motel taxes collected under this Ordinance by the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance will be distributed on a quarterly basis from the local transient guest tax fund to the City of Bellevue, Iowa. Upon receipt of moneys from the local transient guest tax fund, the City of Bellevue, Iowa shall credit such moneys to the general fund, subject to the restrictions set forth in Section 8 below.

Section 8. The revenue derived by the City of Bellevue, Iowa from the local hotel and motel tax shall be used as follows: (A) at least fifty percent (50%) shall be spent for the acquisition of sites for, or constructing, improving, enlarging, repairing, operating, or maintaining of recreation, convention, cultural, or entertainment facilities including, but not limited to, memorial buildings, halls and monuments, civic center convention buildings, auditoriums, coliseums, and parking areas or facilities located at those recreation, convention,

cultural or entertainment facilities; or for the promotion and encouragement of tourist and convention business in the City and surrounding areas; and (B) the remaining revenues may be spent by the City for any City operations authorized by law as a proper purpose for the expenditure within the statutory limitations of city revenues derived from *ad valorem* taxes.

Section B. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section C. Severability. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section D. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO 378 AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009) PERTINENT TO ACCESSORY BUILDINGS IN R-1 AND R-2 DISTRICTS

It was moved by Feuerbach and seconded by Ernst to approve the third and final reading and passage into law upon publication of Ordinance No. 378. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 378

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009) PERTINENT TO ACCESSORY BUILDINGS IN R-1 AND R-2 DISTRICTS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE V APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS, SECTION 5. ACCESSORY BUILDINGS, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 5. Accessory Buildings. No accessory building shall be erected in any yard other than a rear yard except as provided hereinafter. Accessory buildings shall be at least five (5) feet

from lot lines of adjoining lots located in either an R-1 or R-2 District. An accessory building erected on a corner lot shall conform to the setback regulations on the side street. There shall be a minimum distance of five (5) feet between an accessory building and any other separate building or structure on the same lot. There shall be a minimum distance of five (5) feet between an accessory building and any alley line, except that where any entrance to an accessory building faces the alley there shall be a minimum distance of fifteen (15) feet between the accessory building and any alley line. An accessory building erected as a part of the principal building or structure on the same lot and an accessory building connected by a breezeway or similar structure to the principal building or structure on the same lot shall, in an R-1 or R-2 District, be considered as part of the principal building or structure for all yard requirements; provided however, that the minimum rear yard setback requirement for such a principal building or structure shall be fifteen (15) feet. A carport or garage for a residential dwelling may be erected in a side yard provided that a full-required side yard is provided between the garage or carport and the side lot line. Accessory buildings which are not part of the principal building or structure shall not occupy more than thirty (30) percent of the rear yard; however, this regulation shall not be interpreted to prohibit the construction of a five hundred seventy-six square foot (24' x 24') garage on a minimum rear yard.

Section 2. ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE VI SCHEDULES OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, R-1 SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

MINIMUM YARD REQUIREMENTS

Dwellings with no attached or connected accessory buildings:

Front: 25 feet

Rear: 30 feet

Side: One story 8 feet; two or more stories 10 feet

Street Side, corner lot: 25 feet

Dwellings with attached or connected accessory buildings:

Front: 25 feet

Rear: 15 feet

Side: One story 8 feet; two or more stories 10 feet

Street Side, corner lot: 25 feet

Schools, churches and other institutional buildings:

Front: 40 feet

Rear: 40 feet

Side: 20 feet

Street side, corner lot: 25 feet

See Article V Section 7(B)(2)

Section 3. ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE VI SCHEDULES OF DISTRICT

REGULATIONS, R-2 SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 379 AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009) PERTINENT TO HOME OCCUPATIONS AND TOURIST HOMES

It was moved by Ernst and seconded by Lawson to approve the third and final reading and passage into law upon publication of Ordinance No. 379. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 379

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009) PERTINENT TO HOME OCCUPATIONS AND TOURIST HOMES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE III DEFINITIONS, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

HOME OCCUPATION: Any occupation or activity carried on in a single family dwelling by one or more members of the immediate family residing therein, and not employing more than two persons in addition to such family members residing in the dwelling. There shall be no display of goods and/or merchandise visible from the street. There shall be no advertising on the premises with exception of a sign not to exceed one square foot in area, which contains only the name and occupation of any member of the immediate family residing therein. The dwelling used for a home occupation shall not be so rendered by the occupant as to be objectionable or detrimental to the residential character of the neighborhood due to the exterior appearance of the building, the emission of odor, gas, smoke, dust, noise, electrical disturbance or in other way which may constitute a nuisance. Any such dwelling used for a home occupation shall not include any feature of design that is not customary in buildings for residential use.

Section 2. ZONING ORDINANCE, TITLE V APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS, SECTION 21. FOOD SERVICE OPERATION FOR A TOURIST HOME, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

3. If a second special exception for a limited food service operation is granted by the Board of Adjustment, this second special exception shall continue to exist only for so long as the residential building is operational as a tourist home or until the first special exception to operate a residential building as a tourist home lapses or is cancelled, whichever occurs first. If a residential building is not operated as tourist home for a period of thirty consecutive days, it shall be presumed for purposes of this Ordinance that the residential building is no longer operational as a tourist home.

Section 3. ZONING ORDINANCE, TITLE VI SCHEDULES OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, SECTION 2. DISTRICT REGULATIONS, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

A-1 AGRICULTURAL

Special Exceptions.

9. Tourist homes; provided that, in addition to the off street parking required for the regular household, there shall be one additional off street parking space for each bedroom available to the public. This special exception shall continue to exist only for so long as the residential building is operational as a tourist home. If a residential building is not operated as tourist home for a period of twenty-four consecutive months, it shall be presumed for purposes of this Ordinance that the residential building is no longer operational as a tourist home and this special exception shall be canceled and terminated.

R-1 SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL

Special Exceptions.

6. Tourist homes; provided that, in addition to the off street parking required for the regular household, there shall be one additional off street parking space for each bedroom available to the public. This special exception shall continue to exist only for so long as the residential building is operational as a tourist home. If a residential building is not operated as tourist home for a period of twenty-four consecutive months, it shall be presumed for purposes of this Ordinance that the residential building is no longer operational as a tourist home and this special exception shall be canceled and terminated.

R-2 MIXED RESIDENTIAL

Special Exceptions.

5. Tourist homes; provided that, in addition to the off street parking required for the regular household, there shall be one additional off street parking space for each bedroom available to the public. This special exception shall continue to exist only for so long as the residential building is operational as a tourist home. If a residential building is not operated as tourist home for a period of twenty-four consecutive months, it shall be presumed for purposes of this Ordinance that the residential building is no longer operational as a tourist home and this special exception shall be canceled and terminated.

Section 4.Repealer.All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5.Severability.If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6.Effective Date.This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 380

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE IV DISTRICT AND BOUNDARIES, SECTION 2 CHANGES IN OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES(2009)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section A. ZONING ORDINANCE, ARTICLE IV DISTRICT AND BOUNDARIES, SECTION 2. CHANGES IN OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2.Changes in Official Zoning Map. No changes in the Official Zoning Map shall be made except as may be required by amendments to this Ordinance under Article XI of the Zoning Ordinance. If required such changes shall be promptly made and the Ordinance number, nature of change, and date of change shall be noted on the map, together with the signature of the Mayor approving such change in the Official Zoning Map.

Any unauthorized change, of any kind whatsoever, in the Official Zoning Map by any person or persons shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance punishable as provided in Article XIII of the Zoning Ordinance.

Section B. Repealer.All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section C. Severability.If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section D. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 381 AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE JACKSON COUNTY, IOWA BY CHANGING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION TO C2 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL FOR AN AREA OF RIVERVIEW STREET NORTH FROM HIGH STREET TO MOTTE STREET

It was moved by Feuerbach and seconded by Lawson to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 381. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

PARK BENCHES AND TREES

Herrig informed the Council that two of the new memorial benches have been installed in the Riverfront Park area. These benches are the upgrade that was spearheaded by Kurt & Tina Wagner. More benches will be installed in the future. Some bench purchasers have also offered to buy trees. It was agreed that the City would maintain roughly the same number of trees that are there presently and if any trees are removed that they be replaced with new trees. Additional trees could also be planted at Cole Park and Felderman Park if necessary.

CABLE ISSUES

Refinancing of the cable system will be completed in full on Thursday, March 8, 2012. Herrig also updated the Council on some recent outages. One of the outages was caused by a power outage at the transmitting tower in Davenport. Another outage was caused by a problem from a broadcaster in Davenport and the third set of problems were created by recent sun spot activity.

BUDGET MEETING

There will be a public hearing on the City's budget on Monday, March 12, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. Lawson indicated she would not be able to attend due to a conflict but wanted to thank the department heads for their work and their analysis on putting the budget together. The new City budget includes a decrease in excess of 2% on the current tax rate.

CORRESPONDENCE FROM BILLIE ROLING-PULLEY

The Council reviewed the letter from Billie Roling-Pulley indicating that she is in the process of forming a Citizens Group to promote the construction of a recreation center for the City of Bellevue. It is their hope that the recreation center could include work out areas, an indoor pool facility and a day care facility. She is also hoping that the facility can be constructed with no tax dollars from the City. The Council offered their support to the Committee.

CORRESPONDENCE FROM DAN SCHROEDER

The Council reviewed a letter received from Dan Schroeder of Schroeder Construction and Gary Ploeger of River Valley Energy. The letter asked for various items to be considered by the City. It was agreed that the Council would appoint a Committee of Mayor Roling and Councilmembers Ernst and Feuerbach to meet with the City Department Heads in the near future to discuss the request and to schedule a work session with the business owners on Wednesday, March 28, 2012 at 6:30 p.m.
