Regular Session

The Bellevue City Council met in regular session on March 4, 2013 in the Council Chambers at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Christopher J. Roling presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. The roll was called as follows:

#### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Mayor Roling reviewed the Agenda and declared it approved.

#### **AMERICAN RED CROSS MONTH**

Mayor Roling read the proclamation, establishing March 2013 as American Red Cross Month.

#### **COKER TIRE GREAT RACE**

Chamber Director Deanna Cook explained that the Coker Tire Great Race that goes from Canada to Mexico will be going through Bellevue on June 23, 2013. The Chamber would like permission to use the Municipal Parking Lot for a car show on that date.

Ernst moved with a second by Feuerbach to approve the use of the Municipal Parking Lot on June 23, 2013 for a vintage car show. Motion carried unanimously. The boat ramp will be closed for the car show.

**ORDINANCE NO. 389 AMENDING TITLE III COMMUNITY PROTECTION, CHAPTER 7 LICENSING AND REGULATING PEDDLERS, SECTION 3-7-7 FEES, OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009)**

Feuerbach moved with a second by Lawson to approve the Introduction and first reading of Ordinance No. 389. Roll call vote carried unanimously.

Roth moved with a second by Ernst to waive the second and third reading and pass into law upon publication of Ordinance No. 389. Roll call vote carried unanimously.

**ORDINANCE NO. 389**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III COMMUNITY PROTECTION, CHAPTER 7 LICENSING AND REGULATING PEDDLERS, SECTION 3-7-7 FEES, OF THE BELLEVUE CODE OF ORDINANCES (2009)**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** Title III COMMUNITY PROTECTION, CHAPTER 7 LICENSING AND REGULATING PEDDLERS, Section 3-7-7 FEES, of the Bellevue Code of Ordinances (2009) is hereby amended as follows:

3-7-7 FEES. Every licensee shall pay the following fee before a license shall be issued:

1. One day through thirty days:  
\$100 for Peddler/Solicitor; \$50 for Transient Merchant
2. Thirty-one days through six months:  
\$200 for Peddler/Solicitor; \$100 for Transient Merchant
3. Over six months but not to exceed one year:  
\$300 for Peddler/Solicitor; \$150 for Transient Merchant

**Section 2.** *Repealer.* All ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or parts of resolutions, in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

**Section 3.** *Severability.* If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

**Section 4.** *Effective Date.* This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
